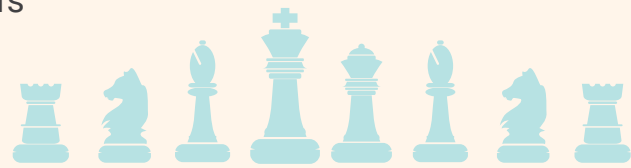
Goodbyes and new beginnings

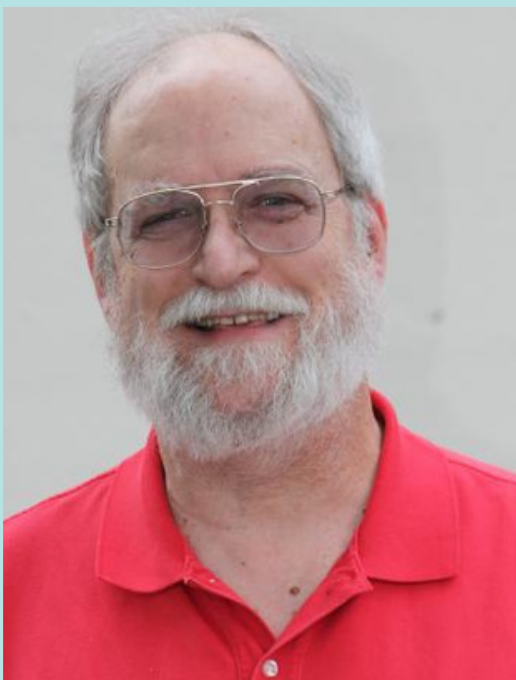

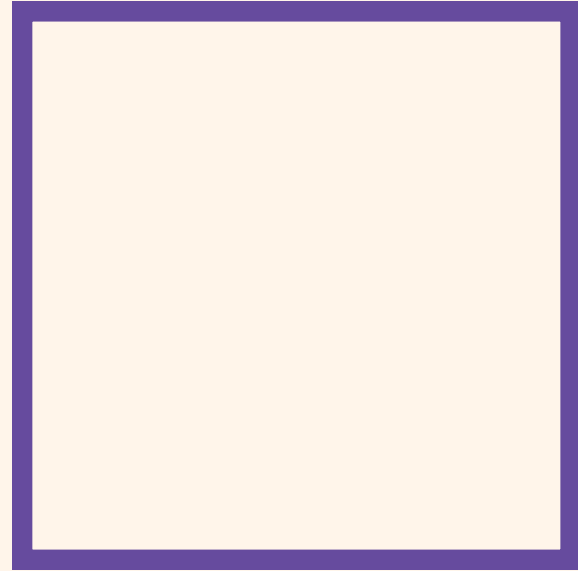

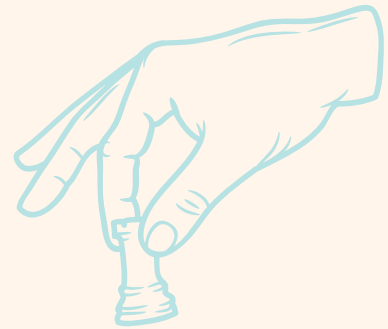
